

The Community Council of Idaho (Formerly Idaho Migrant Council) is a community based nonprofit organization that serves migrant and seasonal farm workers, Latinos, immigrants, and low-income families. The Community Council of Idaho helps those individuals who are considered to be at or below certain income guidelines, as established by its funding sources. The following provides a summary of services currently provided by the Community Council of Idaho, and a list of service locations:

Community Council of Idaho:

Provides housing opportunities for low-income families and migrant seasonal farm workers through the development, construction, and rental of safe, decent sanitary and affordable housing. Creates or enhances economic opportunities and self-sufficiency for the population served. Includes statewide initiative to provide financial education and home buying education services to Latino families.
